Resilience is a skill. It can be learnt and starts with investing time in preparation. Our Resilient Farming Business is a chance for farming partners to take time out to work purely on their business instead of in their business – sharing the load together.

Who is this programme for?

- Access to financial accounts for your farming business
- Ability to understand and read financial accounts (profit or loss statement & balance sheet)
- Ability to prepare and understand a farm budget
